Update: Small Group Effects Big Change

When the Cuenca Soup Kitchen directors learned that a family in our program that faces enormous health challenges was living in squalid, unsafe conditions, we decided that a solution was needed. CSK volunteers were notified and formed an independent group committed to personally rent, utilities, and other expenses so that the family could live in a better, safer environment.


Jhoni (11) and Sami (6) both have osteogenesis imperfecta (severe brittle bone disease). Sami also has cerebral palsy and half of Jhoni's brain is undeveloped. Their father, the breadwinner of the family, died last October of brain cancer, leaving Jhoni, Sami, their two older siblings, and their mother to find a way to survive on the \$240 provided by the government.

This volunteer group is committed to the wellbeing of this family for the long term. In addition to providing much needed medicine, this independently funded initiative has moved the family to a clean and safe home - one with hot water, a bathroom, lights, and rat-free. In addition, the volunteer initiative is committed to providing diapers, a special diet for Sami, and other necessities that are unaffordable on their limited government stipend.
