The first step was the gift of a small keyboard from Emilio Morocho and the next step was lessons. Mati's family can't always afford the medicine for his glaucoma, much less music lessons. And then David Zoernig stepped in and offered to teach Mati, gratis.

Mati can read braille, but learning the shapes of notes and how to read music presented a new challenge which was met by Jeremiah Reardon who carved a set of notes for Mati to experience tactilely.

Many children, including Mati's brother Josue, need medications to live a full life. Partnerships with individuals as well as other foundations mean that CSK beneficiaries receive what they need for their bodies as well as what their hearts dream of. Thank you, Emilio, David, and Jeremiah!
